Learning bird calls is fun and the cool thing is that these are birds all around us. Once you get to know their sounds, even if you can't see them, you can hear them

around you: At some point over the next week, listen to all of them and pick the 5 you most want to learn. I suggest you start with the ones on the first page since they are the ones you are most likely to hear and see.

When you click the site, you can listen to the sound or you can click "sounds". There will be a movie there of the bird and then a variety of its calls.
